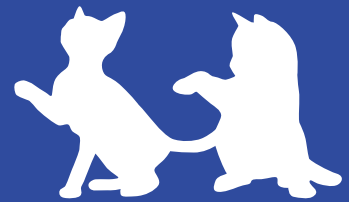


# WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU FIND KITTENS?



When kittens are very young, their best chances of survival are with their mom. Follow this flow chart to help you make the best decision for the kitten's care during COVID-19.

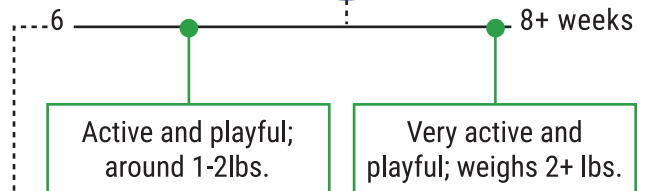
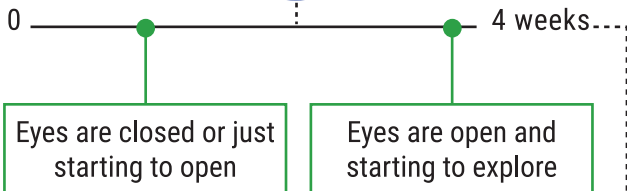

**ESTIMATE THE AGE OF THE KITTENS**

**0-6 weeks**

**ARE THE KITTENS WITH THE MOTHER?**

Leave the kittens where they are. Kittens have a much higher survival rate if they stay with mom at least until 6 weeks of age.
